2024 NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2024 Nominating Committee is composed of eleven (11) members that were appointed by the Board of Directors in accordance with NHEC's Code of Bylaws. One committee member out of the eleven withdrew his seat on the committee. The committee functions independently from the Board and the management team of NHEC. The committee is tasked per the bylaws - "shall use its collective best judgment concerning the qualifications of potential candidates, the current and projected needs, challenges, and opportunities facing the Cooperative, the overall best interests of the Cooperative, and the effective and equitable representation of the membership. In addition to any other criteria which the committee, in its discretion, may consider, it shall consider the geographic location of potential candidates' electric service accounts."

The role of the committee is to evaluate applicants and to nominate the candidates that they believe will best contribute to the governance of the Co-op. When determining its nominations, the committee is guided by the bylaws including "its collective best judgment" along with "any other criteria which the committee in its discretion may consider." The committee members reviewed 12 applications and resumes. During the review process, the committee considered not only the professional experience and education of the 12 applicants but also the candidates' board service and community involvement. The committee interviewed ten (10) candidates. In the fourth meeting, after thoughtful deliberations, a slate of nominated candidates was voted on.

The committee voted to nominate these individuals to a three-year term: Patricia Barbour, Lee; Brian Norton, Campton; Jeff Morrill, Holderness; James Krull, Plymouth; Peter Laufenberg, Thornton; and Paul Bolduc, Bartlett.

Out of the 11-member board, there are four seats up for election to a three-year term in the 2024 election. A Director serves for a three-year term with a maximum of five consecutive terms per Article IV, Section 2 of the NHEC Bylaws. The committee thanks all of the applicants who participated in the nomination process.

We encourage all members to exercise their privilege, as member-owners of the Co-op, to vote in the 2024 election. We also encourage members who are interested, to consider seeking a position on the board in the future.

My current priorities

 Increase electricity reliability and benefits to members while decreasing cost.

- Keep electric rates low. We shouldn't raise rates to cover start-up losses in broadband as the Board did recently. Broadband start-up losses were anticipated; they should be quarantined in that business and paid back as its revenue grows -- not imposed on electric customers.
- Reform electric rates to encourage storage and renewables for interested members without burdening others.
- Be diligent in pursuing a multimillion-dollar pastdue obligation owed to your Co-op and currently in litigation.
- Impose director term limits. The Board voted this down in January, but I will try again.

My asks of you

- 1. Vote -Yes- on the proposed bylaw amendment that guarantees board members' access to necessary information. Directors are obligated to act in members' best interests, but I believe current bylaws do not enable directors to fulfill this core obligation. The proposed amendment remedies that deficiency.
- Cast your votes for Jeff Morrill and Jerry Stringham (as well as myself). We need financially astute board members with business experience. This is a \$185 million-a-year business with \$360 million in assets – not a hobby.


